# **GLOBIS School - Participant Terms and Conditions**

## **Article 1 (Purpose)**

These Participant Supplementary Services Terms and Conditions set out the provisions applicable when a Participant (as defined in the Article 2) uses or participates in the Programs (as defined in the Article 2) of the GLOBIS Executive School provided by GLOBIS ASIA CAMPUS PTE. LTD (hereinafter the "Company").

## **Article 2 (Definitions)**

1. "Client" refers to the corporation that dispatches employees, officers, etc., to the School.
2. "Participant" refers to the individual dispatched by the Client to attend the School.
3. "Contact Person" refers to the individual belonging to the Client who is authorized to handle administrative processing such as application procedures and communications regarding the use of the School based on -these Terms.
4. "The Company" refers to GLOBIS ASIA CAMPUS PTE. LTD.
5. "The School" refers collectively to the GLOBIS Executive School.7. "GES" refers to the GLOBIS Executive School.9. "Program" refers to a Program offered at the GLOBIS Executive School.

## **Article 3 (Application)**

The standard for all dates and deadlines in these Terms shall be Singapore Standard Time.

## **Article 4 (Application for Training)**

1. The Client and Participant shall apply in accordance with the method prescribed by the Company. In the event a Participant applies personally, the application shall be deemed complete upon the Client's approval.
2. If a Participant has a history of using the School and is confirmed to be the same person, the Company may modify existing registered information as necessary based on the input content at the time of application.
3. If the same Course or Program was taken within one year, the Participant may not be permitted to take said Course or Program-.
4. If a cancellation or change is desired after applying for each class, the request must be made through the Client; requests from the Participant will not be accepted. A cancellation charge will be collected in accordance with Article 9 (Cancellation & Changes).

#### **Article 5 (Participation Requirements)**

In principle, Participants must have at least one year of business experience to participate in GES Programs. Additionally, some Programs may have specific conditions due to the nature of the Program.

#### **Article 6 (Restrictions on Participation)**

The Company may refuse an application if it determines that any of the following apply. If the application has already been completed, it shall be treated as a cancellation by the Client, Article 9 (Cancellation & Changes) shall apply, and a cancellation charge shall be billed to the Client.

- (1) When it is determined that the requirements for the applied Course or Program are not met.
- (2) When the Company recognizes significantly inappropriate behavior or a violation of Article 20 (Prohibited Acts) or Article 12 of the separately defined My Page/Virtual Campus Terms of Use (participation may be refused thereafter even before the start or during the term). Furthermore, if the Company deems it necessary, it may report to the Client without the Participant's permission or notice-.
- (3) When a regular student or prospective student of the Graduate School of Management, GLOBIS University wishes to take certain GES Programs.
- (4) When wishing to re-take the same Course/ Program within one year.

#### **Article 7 (Cancellation, Suspension, and Change of Classes)**

1. From the perspective of learning effectiveness, a class may be cancelled if the number of Participants does not reach a certain level, or due to unavoidable reasons.
2. Cancellation of a class will be decided by 14 days prior to the first opening date of said class, and if cancellation is decided, notification will be provided via the Client.
3. Due to instructor circumstances, the lecture may be conducted by a substitute instructor, or the date, time, venue, format, etc., may be changed.
4. After the decision to open, the class may be suspended, cancelled, postponed, or have its format changed in the following cases-:
  - (1) Except for reasons attributable to the Company, when holding the class becomes difficult due to riots, terrorism, acts of God, epidemics, or accidental events beyond the reasonable control of the parties-.
  - (2) In the event of the instructor's unforeseen accident, illness, bereavement, etc..
  - (3) When facility maintenance, inspection, or renovation work is conducted.
  - (4) Other cases where the Company determines that holding the class is impossible due to Force Majeure.
5. If a Course/Program must be changed/cancelled or the term postponed due to the Company's circumstances, any downloaded Deliverables (materials) must be destroyed immediately.

### **Article 8 (Application & Payment of Fees)**

1. In principle, the Client bears the obligation to pay the Course/Program Fees, and the Client shall pay the Course/Program Fees to the Company.
2. However, only when recognized by the Company, the Participant may assume the payment obligation under the instruction of the Client and fulfill it together with the Client. In this case, the Participant shall pay the Program Fees to the Company. However, the Client shall be jointly and severally liable for this debt.
3. Program Fees close at the end of the opening month and shall be paid by bank transfer (transfer fees borne by the payer) by the end of the following month. Credit cards cannot be used.
4. Payment procedures must be completed so that funds are received by the payment due date stated on the invoice issued by the Company after application. If the payment due date is passed without prior notice to the Company, late interest (annual rate of 12%) may be charged.
5. Fees associated with each procedure shall be borne by the payer. In principle, the transfer receipt from the financial institution shall substitute for a receipt. However, for some payment methods, a receipt can be downloaded from My Page/Virtual Campus.

### **Article 9 (Cancellation & Changes)**

1. Changes or cancellations to the application details shall be valid only when there is a request from the Client. In principle, requests from the Participant themselves are not accepted.
2. Cancellation on or after the Commencement Date, and changes to Courses, Programs, or classes are not permitted, and the full amount of Course/Program Fees will be collected. Paid Course/Program Fees will not be refunded.
3. In the event of cancellation, the Participant must immediately destroy any downloaded Deliverables for said Course or Program.
4. If attendance becomes impossible before the opening due to some reason, the paid Course/Program Fees will be collected from the Client in accordance with Article 8.
5. This clause applies even if holding the class becomes difficult due to riots, terrorism, acts of God, earthquakes, epidemics, or accidental events beyond the reasonable control of the parties, excluding reasons attributable to the Company.

### **Article 10 (Preparation of Learning Environment)**

1. The Participant shall prepare the environment necessary for attendance as designated by the Company, such as:
  - (1) An environment compatible with the use of "My Page/Virtual Campus" during attendance.
  - (2) Preparation of software, etc., for assignment creation and submission.
2. Details shall be prepared in accordance with the URL provided and instructions in the syllabus

available upon downloading Deliverables.

3. The responsibility for ensuring the proper functioning of the learning environment rests with the Participant. The Participant shall report any technical issues to the Client as necessary.

4. The Company shall provide no compensation for any troubles related to broadband use or class participation arising from the internet access provider or other telecommunications carriers contracted by the School or the Participant.

5. If disruptions (such as noise or unstable connections) caused by the infrastructure prepared by a Participant significantly impair the learning environment of other Participants, the Company or the instructor may suspend such Participant's participation until the environment is improved.

6. Depending on class characteristics, the use of third-party SNS services, web services, or applications may be recommended. The Client shall ensure that Participants use such services at their own risk and responsibility.

#### **Article 11 (Distribution of Course/Program Materials)**

1. Course/Program materials shall be downloaded and obtained by each Participant from My Page/Virtual Campus starting approximately three (3) weeks before the commencement date of each term. The Company shall bear no responsibility if a Participant is unable to download the materials by the commencement date due to the Participant's own circumstances, or if downloading them immediately before the commencement date interferes with the Participant's attendance.

2. Textbooks and reference books (e.g., the MBA series) for each Course or Program shall be prepared by the Participant or the Client through purchase at bookstores or other means.

3. If a Course or Program is not taken due to cancellation or change after the materials have been downloaded, the relevant materials shall be destroyed immediately.

#### **Article 12 (Attendance Requirements)**

1. A Participant is deemed to have participated in the class only when the instructor can visually confirm the Participant via video, speech, raising hands, etc.

2. If participation time in a class is 2 hours or more of the scheduled time for each Day, the Participant is deemed to have attended said Day and is subject to evaluation-.

3. If participation time is less than 2 hours due to lateness exceeding 1 hour, early departure, stepping out of the classroom, or system disconnection (for online classes), the Participant is deemed absent for said Day.

4. Lateness, early departure, or stepping out totaling less than 1 hour is deemed as attendance in accordance with the preceding 2 paragraphs; however, depending on the frequency or cumulative time in the Course/Program, it may be subject to deduction from the total evaluation score when the instructor determines the overall grade.

### **Article 13 (Grade Evaluation and Completion Certification)**

1. After attendance, an overall grade evaluation is conducted based on prescribed criteria to determine Completion/Failure.

(2) GES Programs: Completion determined by "P/Not Evaluated". P is Completion; Not Evaluated is Failure. "Not Evaluated" refers to not meeting the prescribed evaluation eligibility conditions-

2. Those who meet evaluation criteria can download a "Grade Certificate" from My Page/Virtual Campus after all class grades for the term are finalized.

3. The Participant's grades (attendance, speaking status, various evaluations, etc.) and submissions such as assignments and review books during attendance will be disclosed to the Client.

4. Only submissions made by the prescribed method and within the deadline are subject to evaluation. Submissions not created in the language in which the Course or Program is held are not subject to evaluation.

5. Requests for corrections or changes regarding grade evaluations such as attendance or submission status must be made by the Participant to the School within 14 days from the finalization of the evaluation.

### **Article 14 (Transfer System)**

1. This transfer system applies only when multiple classes of the same Course or Program are offered during the same term. If attendance at the registered class is impossible due to work or other unavoidable reasons, the Participant may attend a transfer class for the same Course or Program under the following conditions. The transfer system merely provides an opportunity to participate, and the following conditions and restrictions apply to evaluation and attendance-:

(1) Registration must be made by the Participant via Virtual Campus by the start time of the transfer class.

(2) The transfer class must be another class of the same Course or Program held in the same term. Reasons other than work or unavoidable circumstances are not accepted.

(3) There must be vacancy in the transfer class.

2. If a transfer occurs, evaluation of speaking and assignments for that Day is performed by the instructor of the transfer class, but the report and overall grade evaluation are performed by the instructor of the original class.

3. Transfers to classes where the order of lectures (Day) is reversed are not permitted, except for some Programs.

4. If a "Report" is a condition for evaluation, it must be submitted by the prescribed deadline of whichever class (original or transfer) has the earlier schedule. If the deadline is passed, the report

is treated as unsubmitted, and the overall grade becomes Failure (Not Evaluated).

5. Use of the discussion function is limited to the original class. Even if transferring, viewing or using the group function of the transfer class is not permitted.

#### **Article 15 (Class Recording)**

1. If the registered class is online, viewing of recorded information is permitted if the Participant is ultimately absent. For this purpose, the Company records and stores footage of each class in online courses. However, if a Participant transfers from a physical class to an online class and is absent, viewing recorded information is not permitted. Recording for absences is a supplementary measure and does not count as attendance.

2. In online classes, footage is recorded and stored. The Company may permit viewing of the recording defined in the preceding paragraph to third parties deemed appropriate by the School, in addition to absentees.

#### **Article 16 (Quality Guarantee)**

1. To demonstrate commitment to service, if the learning effect is not recognized despite meeting evaluation conditions, the Company shall refund the full Course/Program Fees to the payer upon request/deliberation.

2. The request period is within 14 days after Day 6 (or Day 12 for 12-session Programs) of the registered class. If Day 6/12 was transferred, within 14 days of the transfer class date.

3. Refunds are made in principle within 2 months of the request.

4. Limited to 1 Course/Program per Participant; subsequent use is not permitted.

5. Courses/Programs for which Quality Guarantee was applied cannot be retaken.

6. If applied, it will be disclosed to the Client.

#### **Article 17 (Protection of Intellectual Property)**

1. All Intellectual Property Rights in Course/Program materials, supplementary materials, diagrams, voice recordings, videos, etc. (the "Materials"), provided related to the service remain the property of the Company or third parties granting licenses to the Company.

2. Participants shall not use the Materials for the following purposes without prior written consent:

(1) Copying, modifying, reprinting, distributing, public transmission, lending, selling, translating, publishing, etc..

(2) Providing to other Participants or third parties (including sharing within teams/work).

(3) Commercial use.

3. If a Participant violates this and causes damage, the Company may claim damages-.

4. The Company may report violations to the Client and take necessary measures such as restricting attendance.

### **Article 18 (Prohibited Acts)**

The Company may refuse attendance if the following acts are observed. Violations may be disclosed to the Client.

1. Causing information leakage intentionally or via negligence:

- (1) Copying/transferring curriculum/materials (excluding private copies for data storage).
- (2) Quoting/reprinting materials on SNS.
- (3) Recording (photo/audio/video/capture) of classes/recordings or distributing them.
- (4) Inputting Intellectual Property related information into Generative AI.

2. Disclosing Confidential Information shared only within a specific scope to third parties (including SNS)-:

- (1) Disclosing personal info obtained in My Page/Virtual Campus/Class without permission.
- (2) Disclosing information that may hinder other Participants' learning (e.g., class content details).

3. Providing attendance environment info to others:

- (1) Lending/sharing Virtual Campus account.
- (2) Attending classes other than registered/transferred ones, or letting third parties participate.
- (3) Using email addresses accessible by others.

4. Applications/Requests significantly deviating from rules:

- (1) Submitting false info.
- (2) Booking more seats than intended for use.

5. Hindering class operations:

- (1) Harassment, slander, forceful solicitation/sales.
- (2) Obstructing instructors/staff/other Participants.

6. Measures taken for violations-:

- (1) Warning/Guidance.
- (2) Suspension/Revocation of attendance.
- (3) Cancellation of Certificate.
- (4) Report to Client.

### **Article 19 (Academic Misconduct)**

1. Acts of not tackling studies independently, such as viewing past handouts/notes or asking past students.

- (1) Not creating assignments independently, or helping others (referencing past reports, sharing analysis spreadsheets, plagiarism, external help).

(2) Creating assignments using Generative AI.

2. Measures if confirmed:

(1) Invalidated if the object involves overall grade calculation.

(2) "Not Evaluated" for GES reports.

(3) Revocation of attendance/completion for all courses in the term depending on severity.

3. The Company may:

(1) Issue warning.

(2) Disclose/Report to Client.

#### **Article 20 (Handling of Personal Data)**

1. Regarding the purpose of use, scope of joint use, safety management measures, and procedures for disclosure, correction, or suspension of use when the Company handles personal data, the Company shall comply with its separately established Privacy Policy (<https://globis.edu.sg/privacy-policy/>), except as otherwise provided in this Article. Personal data collected by the Company shall be appropriately managed based on said policy and used within necessary scope.

2. Requests for deletion/suspension of use require prior consent/confirmation of both Participant and Client.

3. Learning records are retained for appropriate periods and used for learning support/training management by the Company or Client.

4. Regarding the handling of personal data of Participants residing outside of Japan, the following provisions shall apply in addition to the preceding paragraphs and the Privacy Policy mentioned in Paragraph 1. In the event of any conflict between the provisions of this Paragraph 2 and the Privacy Policy (of either the Company or GLOBIS Corporation, as referred to in sub-paragraph (1) below), the provisions of this Paragraph 2 shall prevail.

(1) Transfer to Japan: For the purpose of providing the Services, administrative procedures, and enrollment management, the Company shall transfer the personal data of Participants residing outside of Japan to servers managed by its parent company, GLOBIS Corporation (located at 5-1 Niban-cho, Chiyoda-ku, Tokyo, Japan). Such data will be stored and processed in accordance with GLOBIS Corporation's Privacy Policy, the laws and regulations of the Participant's country of residence (to the extent applicable), and Japanese law.

(2) Contractors and Sub-processors: To the extent necessary to achieve the purposes described in the preceding item, the Company or GLOBIS Corporation may provide, store, and process Participants' personal data with contractors or sub-processors (including, but not limited to, cloud infrastructure providers and customer management system providers). In such cases, the Company shall ensure that necessary safety management measures are implemented in accordance with applicable laws and regulations.

- (3) **Explicit Consent:** If the explicit consent of the Participant is required for the transfer of personal data to Japan under the laws and regulations of the country of residence, the Company shall obtain such Participant's consent through prescribed methods.
- (4) **Withdrawal of Consent:** While the consent mentioned in the preceding item may be withdrawn at any time, the Participant understands that if such transfer and processing are essential for the provision of the Services, the Services may become partially or entirely unavailable following the withdrawal of consent.

**Applicable Laws:** The Company shall appropriately handle personal data transferred to Japan in accordance with the laws and regulations of the Participant's country of residence (to the extent applicable) and Japanese law.

#### **Article 21 (Others)**

1. The Company may refuse participation if a Participant is found to be an Illicit Party (including those involved in criminal organizations, money laundering, or international sanctions).
2. Use of facilities is limited to the class period.

#### **Article 22 (Survival Provisions)**

Articles 19 (IP), 20.2 (Prohibitions), and 22 (Personal Data) survive termination of service use.

#### **Article 23 (Agreed Jurisdiction)**

These Terms are governed by the law of Singapore. Disputes shall be subject to non-exclusive jurisdiction of the Singapore courts.

#### **Article 24 (Amendments)**

1. These Terms may change without notice; new terms apply immediately. Notification via prescribed method.

**Supplementary Provisions:** Effective March 5, 2026.

# **My Page/Virtual Campus Terms of Use**

## **Article 1 (Purpose and Definitions)**

1. These Terms of Use set forth the conditions for the use of My Page/Virtual Campus at GLOBIS.
2. "GLOBIS" as used in these Terms shall refer to the Graduate School of Management, GLOBIS University, and GLOBIS Corporation.

## **Article 2 (Account Issuance and Compliance)**

1. GLOBIS shall issue a My Page/Virtual Campus account to users who have been permitted to use My Page/Virtual Campus.
2. Users shall comply with these Terms and all other rules and regulations established by GLOBIS when using My Page/Virtual Campus.

## **Article 3 (Management and Operation)**

1. GLOBIS operates and manages My Page/Virtual Campus for the purposes of facilitating smooth application and attendance procedures for users, as well as revitalizing classes and communities.

## **Article 4 (Management of ID and Password)**

1. Users shall bear full responsibility for the management of their My Page/Virtual Campus user ID and password.
2. Users shall not lend, transfer, sell, or otherwise provide their ID or password to any third party.
3. Users shall be solely liable for any damages resulting from inadequate management of their ID or password, errors in use, or use by a third party; GLOBIS shall bear no liability whatsoever for such damages.
4. If a user loses their ID or password or discovers that it is being used by a third party, the user must immediately notify GLOBIS. GLOBIS will take necessary measures, such as changing the ID or password, as required.

## **Article 5 (Registration of Profile Information)**

1. If there are any changes to a user's registered profile information, the user shall promptly complete the prescribed change procedures.

## **Article 6 (Handling of Personal Information)**

1. GLOBIS shall appropriately manage and use personal information on My Page/Virtual Campus within the necessary scope in accordance with its Privacy Policy

(<https://globis.co.jp/en/privacy-policy/>). However, personal information may be disclosed without the individual's consent in the following cases:

- (1) When an official inquiry is received from a public institution such as a court or police based on laws and regulations;
  - (2) When a request for disclosure is received from a partner company that has entered into a non-disclosure agreement; or
  - (3) In other cases where GLOBIS deems disclosure appropriate based on reasonable grounds.
2. If a user requests the deletion or suspension of use of their personal information, GLOBIS shall handle such request appropriately in accordance with Article 35 of the GLOBIS University Japanese MBA Program Participant Terms and Conditions and Article 22 of the GLOBIS School Participant Terms and Conditions.

#### **Article 7 (Disclosure of Profile Information)**

1. For the purposes stated in Article 3, My Page/Virtual Campus shall disclose the following information registered in the profile function to other users who belong to the same class as the applicant: (1) Name; (2) Reading of name (furigana); and (3) Country of residence.

#### **Article 8 (Handling of Content and Community Participation)**

1. Users shall treat all content obtained through My Page/Virtual Campus (including text, images, video, and data) as Confidential Information as defined in Article 11 and shall not use such content for any purpose other than the revitalization of classes and communities.
2. Users may freely post or transmit information on My Page/Virtual Campus at their own risk and responsibility.
3. When participating in a community, if the theme or management policy of that community is specified, the user must participate in accordance with such theme or policy. If GLOBIS determines that a user's participation risks hindering the operation of My Page/Virtual Campus or harming the rights of GLOBIS or a third party (including other users), GLOBIS may revoke the user's participation in that community.

#### **Article 9 (Data Access and Retention Period)**

1. To prevent hindrance to the stable provision of My Page/Virtual Campus due to an increase in access or data volume, GLOBIS permits access to a user's data until a prescribed date.
2. The Class Discussion function is intended for discussion and communication within the applied class, and the access period shall be three (3) years after the end of the relevant

class.

3. For various assignment data uploaded to "Class Details" of the assigned class, the access period shall be six (6) months from the date of submission.
4. For the purpose stated in Clause 1, GLOBIS may delete data or temporarily suspend the provision of services on My Page/Virtual Campus without the user's consent, except for the contents specified in Clauses 2 and 3.

#### **Article 10 (Copyright of Posted Content)**

1. Copyright of content posted or edited by a user via My Page/Virtual Campus (including text, images, video, and data; hereinafter referred to as "the Content") shall remain with the user. However, the user shall grant GLOBIS a worldwide, non-exclusive, royalty-free, sublicensable, and transferable license to use, reproduce, distribute, prepare derivative works of, display, and perform the Content to the extent necessary to achieve the purposes of providing services, quality improvement, research and development, and incidental purposes. The user agrees not to exercise moral rights against GLOBIS.

#### **Article 11 (Confidential Information and AI Research)**

1. "Confidential Information" in these Terms refers to any and all Content posted, uploaded, or edited by a user via My Page/Virtual Campus.
2. GLOBIS may reference, analyze, reproduce, process, and conduct research and development using machine learning and generative AI technology on the Content (including Confidential Information) for the purpose of providing services, improving quality and convenience, developing personalized UI/UX, researching and developing new services and content, conducting academic research to improve learning efficiency, and incidental purposes (collectively, "the Purposes"). The user hereby grants consent for such use.
3. GLOBIS shall manage Confidential Information strictly with the **due care of a prudent manager** and shall not use it for any purpose other than the Purposes.
4. To achieve the goals set forth in Clause 2, GLOBIS may utilize external AI services. In such cases, GLOBIS shall select tools that impose strict contractual obligations to prevent Confidential Information from being accumulated in or reused by the machine learning models of such external services, and such use shall be conducted only within a secure environment determined by GLOBIS.

#### **Article 12 (Prohibited Acts)**

1. Users must not engage in any of the following acts when using My Page/Virtual Campus:
  - (1) Acts that violate laws, regulations, or public order and morals;
  - (2) Acts related to criminal behavior;

- (3) Acts that destroy or interfere with the functions of GLOBIS's servers or networks;
- (4) Acts that obstruct the operation of GLOBIS's services;
- (5) Collecting, accumulating, or sharing with others personal information or other data concerning other users;
- (6) Impersonating another user;
- (7) Directly or indirectly providing benefits to Illicit Parties (including criminal organizations, parties involved in money laundering, or parties subject to international sanctions) in connection with GLOBIS's services;
- (8) Infringing on the intellectual property rights, portrait rights, privacy, reputation, or other rights or interests of GLOBIS, other users of My Page/Virtual Campus, or third parties;
- (9) Posting or transmitting expressions that are excessively violent, explicitly sexual, discriminatory (based on race, nationality, creed, gender, social status, lineage, etc.), encouraging of suicide, self-harm, or drug abuse, or otherwise contain anti-social content that causes discomfort to others;
- (10) Acts for the purpose of sales, promotion, advertising, solicitation, or other profit-making (except those permitted by GLOBIS); acts for the purpose of harassment or slander against other users; or acts of using My Page/Virtual Campus for purposes other than its intended use;
- (11) Religious activities or solicitation for religious organizations; (12) Other acts that GLOBIS deems inappropriate.

#### **Article 13 (Reporting Inappropriate Content)**

1. GLOBIS endeavors to exclude inappropriate posts so that everyone can use My Page/Virtual Campus comfortably. To this end, the cooperation of users is required. If you find a post on My Page/Virtual Campus that you believe violates these Terms of Use, please report it to GLOBIS according to the reporting procedure specified on My Page/Virtual Campus.

#### **Article 14 (Disclaimer)**

1. Users shall use My Page/Virtual Campus upon understanding and acknowledging the following disclaimers:
  - (1) Users shall use My Page/Virtual Campus at their own responsibility, and GLOBIS shall bear no liability for any damages incurred by a user arising from the use of My Page/Virtual Campus, nor shall GLOBIS be obligated to compensate for such damages.
  - (2) The contents of My Page/Virtual Campus shall be provided as they are at that time. GLOBIS makes no warranty of any kind, including completeness, applicability, or utility, regarding the information provided by GLOBIS or the information registered by users.

(3) GLOBIS may change, stop, or suspend the content of the services at any time without notice to users if GLOBIS deems it necessary for the operation of My Page/Virtual Campus. GLOBIS shall not be liable for any damages incurred by a user or a third party due to the suspension, interruption, or delay of the provision of My Page/Virtual Campus for any reason.

(4) GLOBIS may change the conditions, operational rules, or content of My Page/Virtual Campus without prior notice to users, and users shall accept such changes. This includes, but is not limited to, partial modification or abolition of the content of My Page/Virtual Campus.

(5) GLOBIS shall bear no responsibility for the exchange of information between users through My Page/Virtual Campus or any incidental acts thereto.

(6) Regarding the exchange of information between users through My Page/Virtual Campus, if GLOBIS, another user, or a third party suffers damage due to such information being infected with a virus, the user who posted such information shall compensate for the damage. GLOBIS shall bear no responsibility for such damage to the user or third party.

(7) Clause (1), the second sentence of Clause (3), Clause (5), and the second sentence of Clause (6) shall not apply if there is willful misconduct or gross negligence on the part of GLOBIS, or if the user falls under the definition of a consumer under the Consumer Contract Act in Japan.
